Avoidance of Hazardous Substances (RoHS)

The restriction of hazardous substances in products is a worldwide trend.

In Europe, the RoHs Directive (Restriction of the use of certain hazardous substances in electrical and electronic equipment) stands for this, which means the "restriction oft he us of certain hazardous substances in electrical and electronic equipment". For products sold in Europe since 01 July 2006, it requires a ban on the following substances during manufacture and processing:

The concerned (10) substances are:

- lead

mercury

- cadmium

hexavalent chromium

polybrominated biphenyls (PBB)

N-(Hydroxymethyl)acrylamid (NMA)

- polybrominated diphenyl ethers (PBDE)

- di(2-ethylhexyl)phthalate (DEHP)

- butyl benzyl phthalate (BBP)

- dibutylphthalate (DBP)

- diisobutylphthalate (DIBP)

RoHS concerns equipment categories that primarily concern consumer goods:

- large household appliances
- small household appliances
- Information and telecommunicationstechnology equipment
- Entertainment technology devices
- lighting fixture
- Electrical and electronic tools with the exception of large stationary industrial tools
- Toys, sports and leisure equipment
- Automatic dispensers
- electric incandescent lamps and electric lamps in household

In according with the scope of the RoHS Directive, the products of E-tropic does not fall under the listed categories and therefore do n

F-tronic does not fall under the listed categories and therefore do not have to be RoHS compliant since 01.July 2006.
